

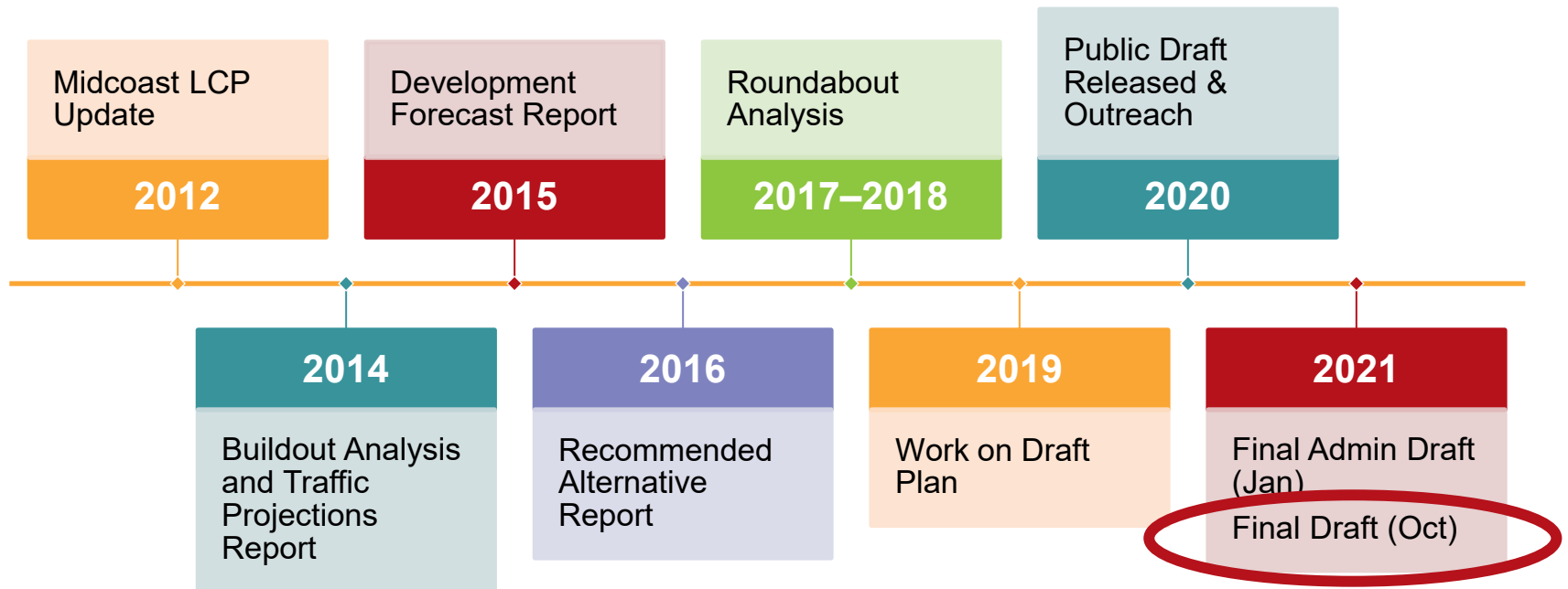

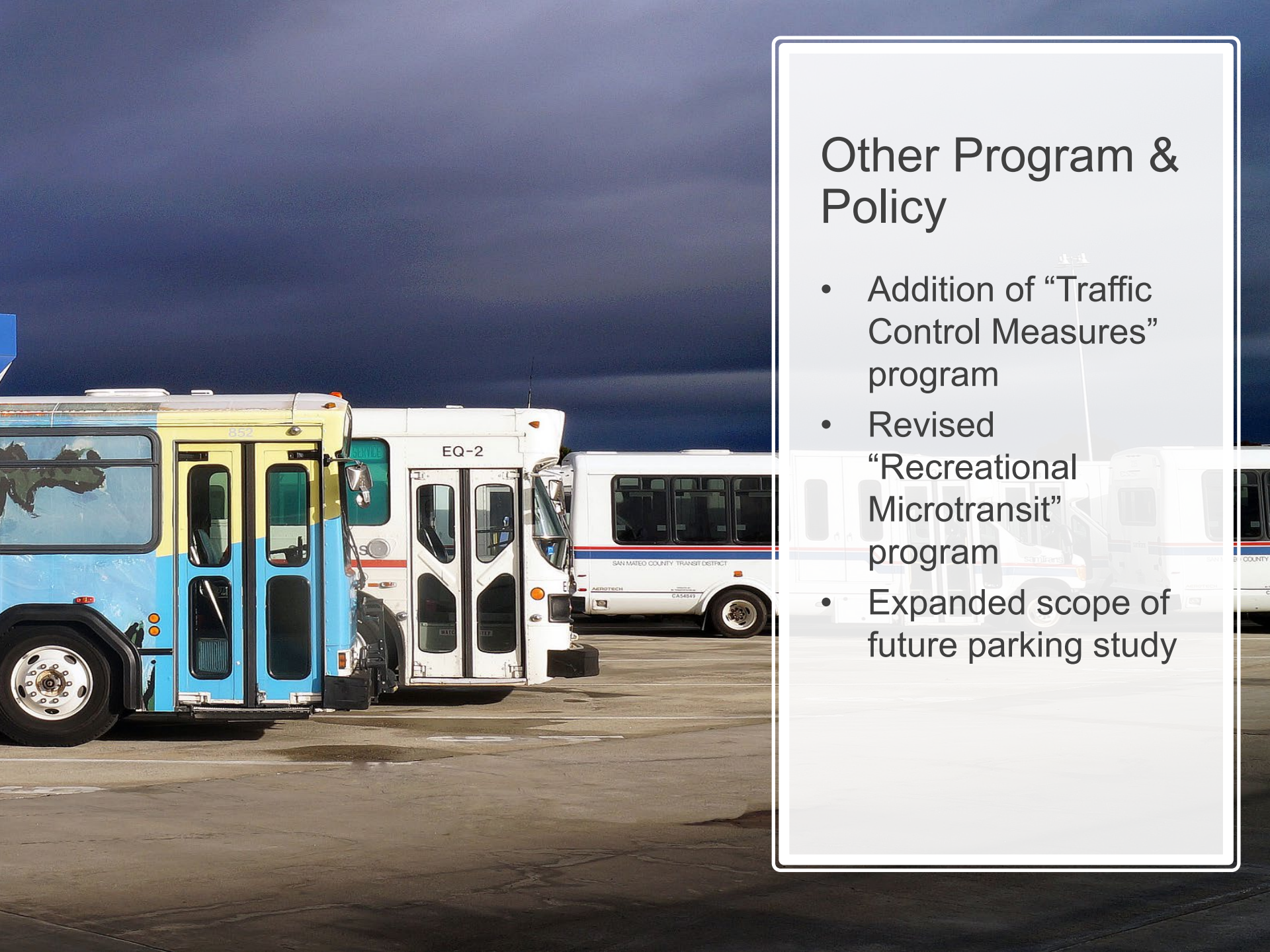

Summary of Feedback & Plan Changes

Land Use Policy Implementation

- Revised feasibility analysis of lot merger
- Found that lot mergers are already occurring due to Witt & Abernathy decisions and 2017 update to subdivision regulations





Other Program & Policy

- Addition of “Traffic Control Measures” program
- Revised “Recreational Microtransit” program
- Expanded scope of future parking study

Infrastructure

- Westside pedestrian path from 10th St to Seacliff Ct in Montara
- Westside path/sidewalk to new Coronado St crossing
- Clarifying detailed design recommendations





Data & Evaluation

- Request for updated data, including visitors, and modeling
- Level of Service and Delay Index in Half Moon Bay

Implementation

- Coordination with other agencies
- Conceptual cost estimates
- Near-term priorities



California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Considerations

- Review with County Counsel; determination that the Plan is not a project under CEQA and therefore not subject to CEQA review
- Individual recommendations to undergo subsequent review to determine whether it is a “project” subject to CEQA and the appropriate level of review
- CEQA considerations memorandum provides more detail
